

COST FOR 2009 FOR TRANSHIPMENT OF GOODS BETWEEN VESSELS IN HAWKE ANCHORAGE PLUS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Costs for 2009 for transshipment of cargo in the Hawke Anchorage and the terms and conditions, applied to this activity are as follows:

1 Harbour Dues

27p (twenty-seven pence only), payable to ABP, for each tonne of rock transhipped between vessels. This charge is *exclusive* of Pilotage and Conservancy charges.

2 Third Party Insurance

ABP to be indemnified against any costs arising from consequential damage to life, property, or the environment. Specifically, documentary evidence must be provided to ABP that the following insurances have been obtained:-

- a) A £100,000 (one-hundred-thousand pounds) indemnity against the cost of removing from the river bed of the Humber any rock which is accidentally spilled overside from the vessels during the transfer operations.
- b) A £1,000,000 (one million pounds) indemnity against accident to other vessels or injury to their crews resulting from the operations. Also, the costs of restoring any damage to the environment, including pollution.

3 Notice to Mariners

£255 (two hundred and fifty-five pounds) plus VAT payable to ABP for the promulgation of a Notice to Mariners, warning shipping of the proposed operations. An accurate date for the commencement of transshipment must be advised to the Harbour Master's Office as soon as it is known to allow sufficient time to promulgate the said Notice.
