VESSELS CARRYING OUT MAINTENANCE WORK
WHILST IN THE HUMBER HARBOUR AREA

OWNERS AND MASTERS OF VESSELS WISHING TO CARRY OUT MAINTENANCE WORK in the Humber Harbour Area whilst underway or alongside any berth, wharf or jetty and where the work has the potential to cause fire, explosion, spillage or pollution or endanger life or property will only do so after first informing VTS Humber of their intention to do so and confirming that a safe system of work is in place covering the procedures.

OWNERS AND MASTERS ATTENTION is drawn to the Humber Navigation Byelaws 1990, byelaw 27,(2), which states:

“The master of a vessel to which this Byelaw applies shall ensure that the vessel is at all times kept in a moveable condition (except when aground in a berth) and shall maintain sufficient power and have sufficient persons on board to carry out the directions of the Harbour Master with reasonable dispatch”.
